DRUG APPROVED

A new drug developed by scientists in Oxford and Cambridge has been sanctioned for use by Nice (the National Institute for Heath and Care Excellence).

Alemtuzumab (or Lemtrada) is said to be a "real step forward" for those in the early stages of MS.

OUTDATED, UNFAIR

The MS Society is supporting a campaign against rises in prescription charges. A coalition of 30 charities and organisations opposing the "outdated, unfair and arbitrary" system already has a petition with 8,000 signatures.

It claims thousands of people are not taking their proper medication because of the cost. The charge rose by 20p to £8.05 in April and another increase is due next year.

Jeff Samways made a fleeting appearance on TV South Today during an item on the spiralling costs of running the health and well-being centres. Jeff was at the Oxford Options centre at Horspath Driftway the day the BBC film crew arrived.

The family of the late Reg Foster, of East Hagbourne, near Didcot, who battled with MS for more than 30 years, donated two bags of new clothes to the branch. About half were snapped up by members at our June Open Day, while the rest was given to the Sobell House hospice charity shop at Kidlington. Our sympathy goes to the family on their loss.

The MS Society has received 60 applications for research funding this year. Decisions on which to support will be made in August and September.

Folk music lovers Kate and Dave Guest have organised their final Folk for MS concert at the Old Mill Hall, Grove. In 25 years, they have raised £45,000 from the annual concert, much of it for the MS Therapy Centre at Milton Park. Kate, who has MS, said: "Dave and I have had a number of health issues and it is just getting a bit much for us."

Hundreds of MS Society supporters will be walking across London on Sunday, September 28 to raise money for MS research. The walk will follow the Thames past many landmarks, including St Paul's Cathedral, the London Eye and the Houses of Parliament. One is 20km, the other 10km. Call **0845 4811577** or visit
