The MS Society plans to embark on its most ambitious fundraising appeal in its 60-year history.

It aims to raise £100m in 10 years, tapping new sources of income to boost its investment in MS research.

The society has already appointed an appeal board, comprising six highly influential and successful business leaders and philanthropists, all with a personal connection with MS.

They are Sir Vernon Ellis, chairman of the British Council; Sir David Walker, chairman of Barclays Bank; Sir Peter Middleton, chairman of Burford Capital; Nicholas Maclean, founder director of the Eykyn Maclean gallery; Josh Kricherfski, chief operating officer of MediaComUK; and Kate Hely-Hutchinson, founder member of the appeal steering group.

The hope is that they will be able to attract new donors and bring closer the day when scientists discover the secrets of MS. The board has already held its first meeting and plans to launch the appeal publicly in 2017.

Meanwhile, the MS Society is working with similar charities in the United States, Canada, Italy and Australia to form the Progressive MS Alliance. The idea is to enable scientists to share knowledge and expertise and avoid duplicating work. It is hoped this will speed up research.

### **END OF AN ERA**

The Venturer, the popular narrowboat, on which our members have enjoyed outings in recent years, is being withdrawn from service.

The specially-adapted vessel has been used by numerous groups, many supporting the elderly and disabled, for days out on the Oxford Canal and River Thames around Oxford since being launched by Prince Charles in 1988. Now, after 26 years, the Oxfordshire Narrowboat Charitable Trust says it can no longer afford to run her.

The boat, built by apprentices on a youth training scheme at Birkenhead, was initially owned by BBC Radio Oxford. The trust took over about 20 years ago.

Trust spokesman Mike Stanley said: "When we took over, it was failing – it was losing money hand over fist. Because we are a charity, we can't use it as a money-making scheme and it's an expensive thing to run. It's been heavily subsidised over the last few years.

"It's sad but we have had to let it go. There are a number of reasons which all added up things have got harder financially and over the years, it became really hard work." The trust had hoped someone would come forward to help continue the service, but there have been no offers. The boat is now likely to be sold and the money given to the charities and other groups that have supported it in the past.

Many of our trips were financed by generous grants from BMW, a legacy from the days when Jeff Samways, our former chairman and fundraiser, worked for the company. Pictures of two of our 'voyages' appear later in the newsletter.

Sue Hannaford, our main regional contact in the MS Society, is leaving after nine years.

The MS Society is reorganising its structure and streamlining its workforce and Sue has decided to opt for voluntary redundancy rather than apply for the new Local Network Officer role.


### **FESTIVE SUCCESS**

The MS Society has announced funding for 15 new research projects from a total of 60 applications it received. They cover a range of topics, including cause, cure, symptom relief and MS services, amounting to £1,450,696. Latest figures show that since 1956, the MS Society has spent almost £150m (at today's prices) on research.

The MS Society was unsuccessful in its bid to be allowed to collect donations outside Tesco stores in the early part of 2015. We hope to have better luck when the second raft of collections later in the year is allocated to charities.

Your membership subscription to the MS Society was due on 1<sup>st</sup> January. Our thanks to those members who have renewed promptly.
