Dear Friends

Mike Homer has set himself a challenge – to travel by train to as many towns with MS branches as possible, including Oxford.

He is planning 10 one-day trips between Tuesday, 2nd June and Monday, 15th June, leaving his home at Fareham, Hampshire, early in the morning and returning late at night, to raise money for MS research.

He writes: "I will travel by train to the furthest point for that day, then work my way back home stopping at different stations where there are MS groups. I will be stopping for half an hour at each station to meet a representative from each branch.

"Each branch rep will then be asked to sign my route sheet and have a photograph taken with me. My daughter Elizabeth has MS and I want to help her and others as much as I can." Mike is 76, was medically retired in 1990 with a balance problem and will be using a power chair to complete what he is calling his MSaTHON. He is due at Oxford station at 20.18 on Thursday, 11th June.

This will be his fifth charity rail run. Previous challenges have raised money for Rowans Hospice at Portsmouth, Military Ministries International, his church and to help a teenage boy travel to America for treatment to a bowel condition.

FIRE HERO

Jane Salway, who has MS, was pushed to safety in her wheelchair during a fire at her home in Manor Road, Bladon.

Her son, Peter, was asleep upstairs when the blaze started at about 5pm on Easter Sunday. Woken by his father, Paul, he dashed downstairs to get her out of the house.

Mrs Salway said afterwards: "My son is a true hero – he saved my life. I thought he was joking, but he rushed me straight out. He moved my wheelchair before I had a chance to think."

Peter said: "Dad banged on the door when I was asleep. I opened the door and there was smoke on the first floor. So I rushed downstairs to grab my mum, then all three of us (Peter, Paul and his sister) ran out – then the house went up in flames."

About 25 firefighters put out the blaze, which caused severe damage to the house and the family's belongings.
