ECONOMY DRIVE

There has been strong support for our decision to publish the newsletter quarterly instead of bimonthly to save money.

As we reported, it costs the branch between £80 and £90 to print and post an eight-page newsletter to 80 members, so cutting out two issues a year will reduce the annual bill by a third (or nearly £200).

The shop, in Bury Street, has been made available free of charge to local community groups, charities and not-for-profit organisations for small-scale activities such as raising membership awareness, displays, meetings and small celebrations.

KEEPING FIT

Laura Godfrey, from Age UK Oxfordshire, writes:

Generation Games, the exercise arm of Age UK Oxfordshire, runs a supervised gym session for people with neurological conditions such as MS at Oxsrad in Marsh Lane, Marston, every Wednesday from 10am to noon.

The gym is accessible to all, with adapted equipment designed for wheelchair users and specialist equipment including two MOTOmeds and a standing frame.

Improve your cardiovascular fitness (heart and lungs) using the static bikes, rowing machine, treadmill or the MOTOmed. Improve your arm and leg muscle strength with the gym machines and hand weights.

The MOTOmed movement trainer is especially suitable for people with limited mobility and wheelchair users. It can loosen and improve arm and leg muscle strength, improve circulation, improve functional capability, reduce stress and reduce water accumulation in the legs (www.motomed.com)

New participants are given a gym induction by Oxsrad staff and a tailored gym programme. The session is supervised by an instructor who provides help on using the machines. It is a closed session so the gym is not open to the public.

To join the session, you need to be a member of the centre (for annual membership costs, contact www.oxsrad.org). Once a member, you pay £3.20 a week.

Generation Games also runs an exercise class for people with MS at the White Horse Leisure Centre in Abingdon on Mondays from 1 to 2pm, £3.30 per session (leisure centre membership rates apply). It is a group class, led by a qualified instructor, focusing on maintaining fitness, strength, balance and flexibility. A range of equipment is used, including a Swiss Ball.

CHOCOLATE TRIAL

Researchers at Oxford Brookes University are carrying out a study to discover if chocolate can help ease the symptoms of MS.

Volunteers taking part in the trial – funded by the MS Society – will test whether hot chocolate drink rich in flavonoids can help reduce fatigue.

Forty people with MS will be given hot chocolate every day over six weeks. For half, the drink will be rich in flavonoids while for the others, it will be low in flavonoids.
