FIGHTING BACK

Many of us who feel we've been treated badly, say nothing and just put up with it. But two branch members with justifiable complaints decided to fight back – with wonderfully surprising results. Read the inspiring stories of Patricia Edwards and Karen Bellinger on the next two pages.

PARKING VICTORY

Patricia Edwards, who has MS, has successfully persuaded Oxfordshire County Council to drop plans to remove parking spaces near her home.

As we reported in the last newsletter, she feared she would have to give up her work as an Oxford college administrator if she could not park near her home in Headley Way, Headington.

She has difficulty walking more than a few yards yet, under the original £12.5m Headington traffic scheme, the parking space she uses would have disappeared to create cycle lanes.

The nearest road with parking would have been 160 yards from her home and not designated for disabled residents. But now, partly as a result of Patricia's protests, the council has backtracked.

Patricia, a member of our branch, writes: "You very kindly highlighted my plight in the last newsletter. In a follow-up to this, which may well be of interest to other people with MS, I have wonderful news to report.

"After three consultations by the council, it decided at a meeting on 9th June to pass the

latest proposals in the 'Access to Headington' plans, which include retaining some on-road parking for residents in Headley Way and Windmill Road.

"I cannot express the relief I felt that after nearly a year of battling with the council, Cyclox (a cycling organisation) and other parties, a good compromise has been reached, taking all viewpoints into account.

"The road is to be widened, there will be segregated cycle lanes and some car parking spaces will be retained. Common sense has prevailed!

"Needless to say, my MS symptoms worsened over this last year, possibly due to the incredible stress and worry over what looked certain to be the loss of my independence and ability to work.

"Now just the impending road works to deal with, but that's fine. They will pass and I will still be able to get to work. Anyway, the fight was worth it!"

Well done, Patricia! It just goes to show that it is worth putting up a fight if you think you have a worthy cause.

KAREN'S BOUQUET

Branch member Karen Bellinger received a bouquet of flowers, a voucher and two letters of apology after being the victim of appalling behaviour by a delivery driver.

Knowing a parcel she was expecting was coming, Karen sat near an open window at her Abingdon home and when she saw the delivery man arriving, she shouted she was coming and opened the door within 90 seconds.

The man shouted "I'm busy, busy", slung the parcel into the hall and hurried back to his van, where he sat for several minutes (not in such a hurry after all!). The parcel landed in the hall, blocking access to the cloakroom and toilet. It was too heavy for Karen to move.

Karen's partner, John Faint, who was out at the time, wrote a strong letter of protest to delivery company Yodel and received letters of apology from both Yodel and Greenfingers, the company whose parcel it was delivering. Karen also received flowers from Yodel and a voucher from Greenfingers. John writes: "Our complaint to Yodel has elicited a better response than we hoped for. Our experience may raise a wry smile and encourage others not to take matters lying down." The good news is – the driver no longer works for Yodel.

CAKE BREAK

Dorothy and Michael Warner raised the grand sum of £203 for our funds when they organised a Cake Break at their home in Abingdon.

Many of their friends joined branch members for an afternoon of tea, cake and friendly chat – a picture of some of them is included later in the newsletter. So much cake had been made that we couldn't eat it all!

An added bonus, particularly for the men, was that Michael had his extensive model railway display up and running in the garage, bringing back memories of the glorious steam age.

- 1. The subscription is £12.00 per year payable in June. Members are permitted to join at any time throughout the year paying £1.00 per calendar month for the remainder of the year.
- 2. All Members must be over the age of 16 and must fill in an application form (attached).
- 3. 50% of the monies collected for the quarter will be distributed in prize money; the other 50% will go to branch funds. From that 50% prize money there will be three prizes:

- 10. Members wishing to leave the 100 club may only do so at the membership year end. Refunds will not be given for people wishing to withdraw before the year end.
